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RESPONSIBILITIES OF ANTI-RAGGING COMMITTEE

The Anti-Ragging Committee in educational institutions plays a crucial role in maintaining a safe and supportive environment for all students. Their primary responsibility is to prevent, monitor, and take action against ragging, which can cause physical and psychological harm to students. The committee follows all the directions from UGC, DCI, KNRUHS and Government of Telangana. The Anti-Ragging Committee in the institution will function as per the following guidelines.

1. Prevention of Ragging

- **Awareness Campaigns:**

By organizing campaigns, workshops, and seminars to educate students, faculty, and staff about the negative impacts of ragging and how to prevent it.

- **Guidelines and Rules:**

By implementing and adherence to anti-ragging policies, rules, and regulations in the institution. These may include the prohibition of certain types of behaviours and mentioning clearly the consequences for violating the rules.

- **Orientation Programs:**

By conducting orientation sessions for new students to familiarize them with the rules, highlighting the importance of maintaining a ragging-free environment. The committee also taken online anti-ragging affidavit from all students as mandated by Government of India.

2. Monitoring and Surveillance

- **Surveillance Measures:**

By installing CCTV cameras in vulnerable areas, like hostels and common spaces, to detect ragging behaviour and monitor activities.

- **Student Feedback:**

By regularly collecting feedback from students through surveys, suggestion boxes, or meetings to detect any early signs of ragging.



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- **Nominate Anti-Ragging Squads, and Teams :**

By designating responsible staff members who are trained to address complaints related to ragging.

3. Complaint Redressal

- **Complaint Mechanism:**

The committee has established an accessible and anonymous complaint system for students who wish to report incidents of ragging.

- **Investigation:**

By promptly investigating complaints and take appropriate action based on the severity of the ragging incident and as per law.

- **Confidentiality:**

The committee ensures that the identity of the complainant is kept confidential to avoid retaliation and protect the safety of the individuals involved.

4. Punitive Action

- **Disciplinary Action:**

The committee suggests to take strict disciplinary actions, ranging from warnings to expulsion against students found guilty of ragging to the college authorities.

- **Report to Authorities:**

In cases of severe ragging, the committee is responsible for reporting incidents to local authorities, including the police, and ensuring that legal action is taken.

- **Counselling and Support:**

The committee offers counselling to both the victims of ragging and those accused of ragging to address the psychological effects.



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5. Awareness and Training for Staff

- **Staff Training:**

The committee insists to train faculty members, hostel wardens, and other staff members on identifying signs of ragging and handling sensitive situations.

- **Role in Prevention:**

The committee encourages staff to actively participate in monitoring student behaviour and report any suspicious activities.

6. Collaboration with External Bodies

- **Government and Legal Compliance:**

The committee ensures that the institution's anti-ragging efforts are in line with national or regional laws, such as those mandated by the University Grants Commission (UGC), DCI & KNRUHS.

- **Cooperation with NGOs and Experts:**

The committee works with external organizations and experts who specialize in handling ragging issues, especially for counselling and preventive measures.

7. Regular Review and Reporting

- **Review Policies:**

The committee periodically reviews the anti-ragging policies and update them as needed to ensure effectiveness.

- **Reports:**

The committee regularly submits the reports on anti-ragging activities, complaints, and outcomes to the management and higher authorities.
