RESPONSIBILITIES OF CONDEMNATION COMMITTEE

A condemnation committee is typically responsible for reviewing and making decisions regarding the condemnation of instruments and equipment in the college in all departments. The specifics of a condemnation committee's responsibilities can vary depending on the nature and material to be condemned, but these are some of the general duties they will handle. The key responsibilities of a condemnation committee:

1. Assessment of Equipment Value:

- The committee often plays a role in determining the fair market value of the equipment to be condemned. This helps to ensure that the department to which the equipment belongs be provided with new equipment.

2. Review of Procedural Requirements:

- The committee ensures that the condemnation process follows all procedural requirements. This includes ensuring that proper checking by the department equipment in charge and checking by bio medical in charge before coming to a conclusion to condemn the equipment or instrument.

3. Evaluation of Necessity:

- The committee evaluates whether the condemnation serves a legitimate replacement for the clinical need, so that request for another alternative can be sent to the purchase committee.
- The committee is empowered to evaluate the cost of the repair and efficacy of its performance after repair. If its not financially viable the committee can recommend for a new purchase instead of repair.

4. Recommendation to Authorities:

- After reviewing all the relevant factors, the committee can make a recommendation to the administration or authority that has the power to approve or reject the condemnation.
